I remember when I was young, my parents used to tell me that those were dangerous places where sex industries operated. Apart from that, I truly had no clue about the lives of prostitutes. I only got to visit them for the first time when I came into contact with the Companion Ministry.

Tears of the prostitutes

I really felt uneasy when I first visited those places, as on the door of every room were erotic photos and lewd descriptions. Most of the prostitutes have come from Mainland China and are between the ages of 30 and 50. Many were forced to enter the business due to broken marriages with local men and an enormous economic burden.

I have seen some of the business' "newcomers" cry because they could not adapt to this kind of life. Even some of the more experienced ladies were suffering from insomnia because of immense pressure. My heart is pierced every time I see them respond to their misfortunes in life with a forced smile, yet there really is little I can do.

Even so, I still see a ray of hope. And that is us walking with them through the highs and lows in life. Prostitutes are in fact very lonely. Not only do they have to hide their job from their children, they also have no one to whom they can pour out their heart. Our ministry therefore serves as an answer to their needs. We listen to them and offer them a helping hand.

I thank God for bringing me to the prostitutes, and for letting me know more about a marginalized group in our society. Their broken lives have made me see how much people need the gospel! Without the love and hope from God, prostitutes can only live in darkness. It is my hope that through the Companion Ministry we can be ambassadors of Christ, bring faith, hope and love to them and change their lives.

When I first knew him, he was very worried that his DSE results would not be good enough for him to apply for the Police. He also had little confidence in his Chinese proficiency and felt that he could never pass the Police's examination. In view of that, I started practicing Chinese with him one-on-one twice a week.

Exchanges after class

We would take a lot of time to share after each practice. I am very thankful that we were able to get to know each other better in this period. We would share our future plans and discuss various social issues. He would also tell me his worries about DSE, interesting stories at school and even the wrong things that he had done. I was very happy to see him strive to learn Chinese in order to make his dream come true and that his effort was paying off. We also practiced interview skills together to prepare him for summer job interviews and applying for the Police. Later, he also shared with me his joy after passing his HKDSE and successfully finding a job.

Even though I have not been able to share the good news with him yet, I am very thankful for the opportunity to accompany him through various decisive moments and events, and become his supporter and friend. I thank God for teaching me how to first love Muslims and become their companion, as well as for allowing me to partake in their lives as I continue to serve and showing care to them.

"MDT has changed my life!" These are the words that I keep telling everyone after coming back. I say that because I have experienced firsthand the God's love and power to transform lives, witnessed how He stretched out His mighty hand in different places to bring people out of the dark and into the light, and had deep, face to face encounters with people who were still struggling in all sorts of bondage.

Controlled by love, responding in love

The brothers and sisters who joined the training in South Africa have two things in common: 1. they know who Jesus is and basically are willing to follow Him, 2. they have different stories of brokenness, rebellion or being lost, they experienced God's salvation but might not have a close and stable relationship with Him. In the first month of training, apart from learning more about God's heart and properties, trainees

to God through prayers and the guidance of spiritual mentors. It was like allowing God to open up and examine wounds that have healed on the surface, letting Him gently pick out the small bits of sand and dirt, and finally healing the pain and closing the wound with love. In the sharing session a month later, I was amazed by how God solved the nagging problems that had been bothering us for years. Having tasted the grace, love and power of God, each of us became more able to present our requests to Him, understand His will and maintain a closer relationship with Him.

God brought us people from very different backgrounds and cultures during our four outreaches. He also broadened our spiritual vision and used us to bring the good news into the dark. In a rural area in Lesotho, I met, for the first time, a person filled by an evil spirit. We prayed for this lady and sang hymns to God. After half an hour, the evil spirit left her. "Thank you Jesus!" She smiled as she regained consciousness. This event made me realize the reality of the spiritual warfare. In the inner city area of Pretoria, God led us to serve among prisoners, homeless people, prostitutes, pimps and street kids. As we saw these broken lives enslaved by sin, the Holy Spirit taught us to be filled with the love and compassion of the Lord Jesus. Many brothers and sisters started to use their own stories to testify what God did in their lives,

and helped these people understand the love and forgiveness upon the Cross, as well as the hope of being born again and eternal life. The Spirit was indeed touching people's hearts and I saw many lives changed and transformed.
